Its collections include more than 175,000 bound volumes and tens of thousands of journals, periodicals, and newspapers; more than 17,000 feet of manuscript and archival collections; nearly 1000 audio tapes; hundreds of artifacts; 100,000 prints, photographs, maps, and other graphic items.

The digitization of the collection was made possible by a major gift from the Citigroup Foundation. The African American Pamphlet Collection was accessioned in 1990-91 from a miscellaneous pamphlet collection in the Rare Book and Special Collections Division. The pamphlets were published from 1824 through 1909. Most were written by African-American authors, though some were written by others on topics of particular importance in African-American history. Seventeen of the collection's titles, and many of its authors, can also be found in *African American Perspectives: Pamphlets from the Daniel A. P. Murray Collection, 1818-1907*.

Like the Murray Pamphlet Collection, the African American Pamphlet Collection presents a panoramic and eclectic overview of many aspects of African-American history and culture. The collection includes first-person accounts of slavery, tracts from anti-slavery organizations, legislative and presidential campaign materials, investigative reports, sermons, commencement addresses, organizational proceedings, and previously published materials from newspapers

and magazines. The African American Pamphlet Collection was selected for digitization because of the historical significance and rarity of its contents, as well as its complementary value to other American Memory collections, most notably *African American Perspectives. From Slavery to Freedom: The African-American Pamphlet Collection, 1824-1909* presents 397 pamphlets from the Rare Book and Special Collections Division, published from 1824 through 1909, by African-American authors and others who wrote about slavery, African colonization, Emancipation, Reconstruction, and related topics. The materials range from personal accounts and public orations to organizational reports and legislative speeches. Among the authors represented are Frederick Douglass, Kelly Miller, Charles Sumner, Mary Church Terrell, and Booker T. Washington. *From Slavery to Freedom* was made possible by a major gift from the Citigroup Foundation and complements *African American Perspectives: Pamphlets from the Daniel A.P. Murray Collection, 1818-1907*
